A team of CDx pathologists will then carefully evaluate your tissue sample assisted by proprietary 3D imaging and AI technology and provide a diagnosis to your doctor.

The collected cells are sent to the CDx lab for special analysis. CDx then provides your doctor with diagnostic information to better manage your health.

Insurance coverage for your WATS^{3D} biopsy procedure.

CDx directly bills your medical insurance carrier for its analysis. The CDx laboratory is currently in the process of becoming an in-network provider with most medical insurance plans. In the meantime, you will not be responsible for out-of-network fees associated with these plans.

What this means for you



In-network plans: If CDx has a contract with your medical insurance carrier, we are contractually obligated to bill standard copays, coinsurance, and/or deductibles that your plan views as patient responsibility. These plans include Medicare and Medicare Advantage.



Out-of-network plans: If CDx does not have a contract with your medical insurance carrier, you will not be responsible for amounts that your insurance plan does not cover. Out-of-network insurance carriers have been notified about our billing policy.

Following the WATS^{3D} procedure, you will receive an explanation of benefits (EOB) from your insurance carrier. **The EOB is not a bill.** If we are required to collect a payment from you, please wait to make a payment until after you have received an invoice from CDx.

In addition, some insurance carriers will send payments for CDx's laboratory services directly to you as the insured/policyholder. If you receive a payment from your insurance carrier for our services, you do not need to wait for an invoice. Instead, simply forward that payment with a copy of the EOB to:
